KU Study Abroad Program Models

<u>University of Kansas reciprocal exchange, direct enrollment, faculty-led, internship and research programs</u> are derived from formal agreements with international and domestic partners, programmatic relationships, and faculty contacts (for research programs). Some of the greatest advantages of KU-sponsored programs are quality assurance and being able to leverage institutional knowledge & relationships for the benefit of KU departments and students. A diverse array of program types provides opportunities for the greatest number of KU students to have an experiential educational opportunity abroad. Students who cannot meet their needs through one of KU's existing programs have the opportunity to participate in a Student-Initiated Program (SIP) through an external provider.

KU reciprocal exchange programs	Exchange students are nominated by partner institutions and must pay their home institution's tuition in order to study abroad. In exchange, the host institution waives (or at KU - pays for) the international student's tuition and associated fees. This can be the most economical option for KU students. In order to ensure the long-term viability of reciprocal exchanges, KU requests that these be departmentally sponsored (although open to a broad student constituency).
